A little over ten years ago some Mbano indigenes with vision gathered in the “stone mountain state” to commence this charitable and humanitarian venture. We are here today to celebrate that beginning. Since the formation of this organization, a lot has been accomplished in our efforts to support our communities and care for the underprivileged. For the past seven years, we have worked tirelessly to put some initiatives together. We have kept up the momentum to actualize and bring our collective efforts to fruition.

- We established the most expansive organization of umu Mbano in diaspora.
- Created awareness and vision for the realization of the first Ezurumezu festival in Mbano.
- Supported and ultimately sponsored annual Mbano Medical Missions to provide free healthcare to the underprivileged in our communities.
- We implemented the Education Grant program that makes awards to deserving high institution students in Mbano.
- We conducted Essay Competitions for Mbano Children in the USA. The first in the history of Mbano indigenes in the United States.
- We have worked to bring all factions of our community into a more cohesive union by desensitizing and denouncing sectionalism. We have maintained an open door policy, demonstrated compassion and yet stood firm on matters of principles. We stood for the best interest of Mbano, regardless of personal interest or polity.
- We have worked hard to accommodate everyone, expanded the role of our Ladies, involved our children, and established a Membership and Youth program to enable us expand on membership benefits.
- Our vision and agitation created the awareness that rippled through the community and culminated in the election of the first Mbano indigene as Governor of Imo state.
- We have expanded our organization to eleven affiliate chapters that are spread across the United States of America. We also have three more prospective chapters in the making.
- We established a state-of-the-art web site for Mbano which has enabled on-line communication with our brothers and sisters worldwide. This has been an effective forum for information sharing.
- We sponsored the Mbano Unity Cup soccer competition which provided recreation and networking opportunities for our youth.
- We have liaised with our Ndi Eze, our Local Government Chairpersons, and established a cordial cooperative relationship with Imo State Government. We continued to give our Governor full and relentless support, regardless of intricacies of Nigerian polity.
- We are seriously working on the revitalization of our Micro Credit Finance initiative and to create investment opportunities that will benefit our people.

In fact, we have accomplished a lot. However, there is still more work to be done. Our elders said that “Oru gagwu nwantolu ogu agaghi ezuike”. In other words, “Unless the farming season is over, the little garden hoe will not get some rest”. So, Umu Mbano, we have to roll our sleeves and face the challenges of MNA’s second decade of existence. It is also important that we continue to liaise with our community leaders and ensure that nwa Mbano continues to occupy “Douglas House” for the next five years. So, we must work with our Governor and continue to give him full and relentless support.
