Communiqué issued by the Mbano National Assembly Inc, at the end of their 11th Annual Convention held at the Sheraton Gateway Hotel, Atlanta from May 28-31, 2010. **PREAMBLE:**

he Assembly of Umu Mbano in the United States, celebrating a decade of unwavering commitment to the development of our homeland, with the presence of distinguished members of our communities; Dr Michael C. Anyaeze and Chief Goddy and Lolo Joy Mbawuike; jubilant in an appraisal of the past decade and determined to face the coming decade with enthusiastic optimism. The Assembly thus encouraged by the zeal of our membership and united by the future we envisage, unanimously declare and affirm the following: **1.** The past decade has been a success as we initiated, implemented and partnered with relevant entities to actualize the following:

A: Free Medical Mission successfully implemented for 7 consecutive years. Treating thousands and performing numerous major surgeries to our kinsmen and women.

B. Provided Education Grant to several of our people in higher institutions

C. Promoted sports and recreation among our youth through the Unity Soccer Competition

D. Encouraged the formation of the Ezurumezu, a cultural awareness initiative that brings all our people together.

E. Introduced the microcredit program to provide small scale loans to deserving members of our communities.

F. Improving community awareness amongst our folks in the Diaspora especially, the United States of America.

G. Encouraging our youth in the Diaspora to think Mbano through seminars, symposiums and essay competition with topics focusing on Mbano; examples include: Mbano Nne ji, Mbano Bu Alanyi, Mbano Ga N'iru, Mbano Gburugburu etc.

H. Developed a Website for communicating with our people across the globe.

I. Agitated for Mbano Socio-Political relevance since inception.

2. The Assembly is thus poised to refocus our energies to challenges of the 21st century while keeping faith with successful programs of the past. This is in line with our mission, which is to "promote community healthcare, education and economic empowerment, especially the underserved and underprivileged in our communities". We thus propose the following as a tripod of our future engagements in the next decade.

A. Membership and youth program.

We are poised to working with committed entities, whether individuals or corporate, within or outside our communities to advance the objective of economic empowerment.

3. These laudable objectives can only be fulfilled in a stable polity thus the sustenance of true democracy becomes sine qua non to the realization of these initiatives. Having studied diligently the political climate in Imo State with a view to moving Mbano forward **the Assembly** stands united to ensure that "Nwa Mbano" remains in Douglas House, Owerri for the next five years. **The Assembly** is impressed with the accomplishments of the state government despite it being mired in a continuous legal tussle. Its accomplishments in the areas of infrastructure development, job creation, Agricultural revitalization and road construction, despite prevailing hurdles deserve commendation. **The Assembly** believes that given a more conducive political environment, greater achievements will be recorded. **The Assembly** therefore applauds the achievements of Governor, Ikedi Ohakim.
